

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ERIN

By-Law Number # 98 - 14
A By-law to regulate lawn
and gardening watering in the
Town of Erin.

WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P. 52, Section 12 provides that every Council may pass by-laws for regulating the time, manner, extent and nature of the supply and use of the water distribution system in order to secure to the inhabitants a continued and abundant supply of water;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ERIN HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

REGULATIONS

1. The use of municipal water supply for **lawn and garden watering** in the Town of Erin shall be **restricted to**:
 1. even-numbered households on even numbered calendar days between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. and between the hours of 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.;
 2. odd-numbered households on odd numbered calendar days between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. and between the hours of 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.
2. The Corporation of the Town of Erin may **ban outside water usage** other than for emergencies to ensure an uninterrupted supply of water from the Municipal water system.
3. Every person shall comply with emergency restrictions specified by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Erin.
4. Such lawn and garden restrictions as set out in Section 1, or a ban of outside water usage as set out in Section 2, shall be set out in the form of a Notice which shall be published at least once in a local newspaper of general circulation a minimum of one week prior to the restrictions becoming effective.

ENFORCEMENT

5. This By-Law may be enforced by a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer duly appointed by the Corporation of the Town of Erin.
6. Every person who contravenes any provision of this By-Law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P. 33, as amended.

REPEAL

7. Village of Erin By-Law 93-8 and Township of Erin By-Law 11-92 are hereby repealed.
