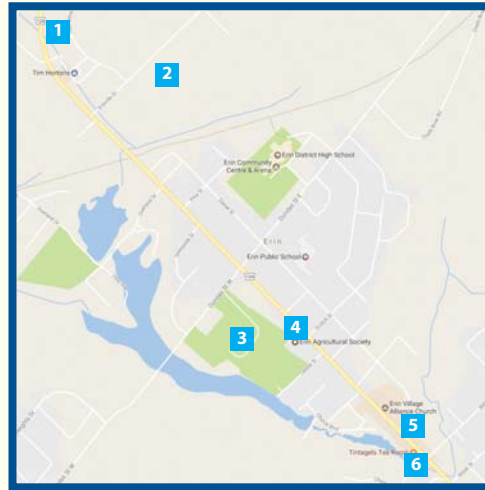

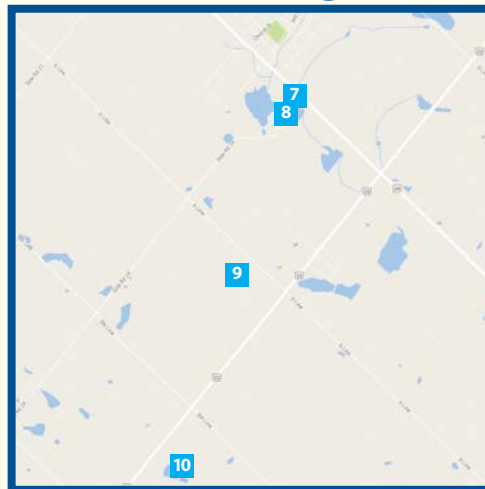

All Saints Anglican Church

All Saints Anglican Church is celebrating its 150th year in the community of Erin. This little church was built in 1867 and has kept its historical charm throughout several additions and renovation projects. One of those renovations included the installation of a beautiful Casavant pipe organ. Visit during Doors Open to hear this gorgeous instrument and enjoy delectable treats.

Downtown Erin Heritage Walking Trail

Learn about Erin's fascinating architectural history on a self-guided hour-long tour, or join local history enthusiasts Phil Gravelle and Jean Denison on a special guided tour. From parks and cenotaphs to churches and Victorian homes, this tour brings the town to life in a fascinating and compelling way. Century Church Theatre

Built in 1906, this church has original elm panelling and curved pews, stained-glass windows, horse-tethering rings and many features that were modern for its time. Regular services ended in 2003, although the Good Friday service continued until 2014. The church is now the home of the Century Church Theatre, as well as one of Ontario's largest bat colonies!

Hillsburgh House by the Pond B&B

Hillsburgh House is a charming century farmhouse in the beautiful town of Hillsburgh, featuring two guest rooms, lovely gardens and a peaceful view of the mill pond. Everdale is an organic teaching farm in the beautiful rolling hills of Hillsburgh! This not-for-profit farm believes in the power of locally grown food to fuel positive economic, social and ecological change. They also run several farm school programs for kids and a weekly vegetable pick up program called the Harvest Share. Woodlands Farm

Woodlands Farm raises thoroughbred racehorses. This land, part of the McKinnon ancestral farm, has raised multiple Queen's Quineas winners and a Queen's Plate champion. Residing at the farm are this year's foals and their mothers, young racehorses in training, as well as older horses. The owners look forward to introducing you to these beautiful animals.
