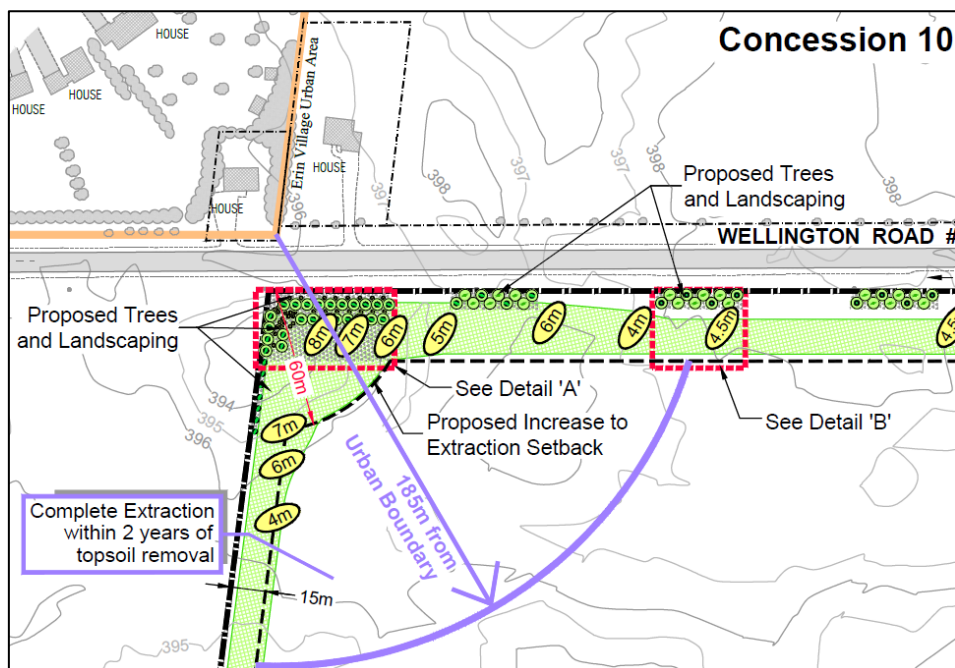
**RE: Halton Crushed Stone Limited April 17, 2018 Council Meeting**

For the purposes of the Tuesday Council meeting we would like to provide the following information for Council consideration.

First, we have reviewed the County Planning Report dated April 6, 2018 which recommends approval of the planning applications and the removal of the Town's objection to the licence application provided we confirm that all technical recommendations and site plan notes agreed to through the planning process will be included on the aggregate site plans. We are advising Town Council that we agree with this condition and that these matters have been included on our aggregate site plans.

Furthermore, in response to the input received at the March 6, 2018 Public Meeting, we would agree to the following as additional conditions of Town support and approval of our applications.

- a. Time limit of 2 years from removal of topsoil to completion of extraction within 185m of the urban boundary.



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- b. Monitor water quality downgradient of recycling areas.
- c. Early planting of trees in northwest corner of Phase 1: following approval of planning applications (rather than within 1 year of licence)
- d. Annual application of calcium chloride flake to the 10<sup>th</sup> Line (from entrance gate to Wellington Road 52) (in addition to any normal Town maintenance) and; clean up any aggregate products (if any) that are spilled on Wellington Road 52 by trucks leaving the site.

These are in addition to the previous changes that have been communicated to Town Council and the community that has taken an interest in our application.

Finally, we wish to thank the County and Town staff as well as the Erin community for working through this process over the past two years. We are asking for the Town Council support of the proposal that has been presented to you. We also confirm our intention to continue to work with the Town and its residents as we move through the remainder of the review process.
