

Walking Trails

- A Town of Erin Trails committee has been formed in May 2016.
- This committee will have access to trails grant monies from the County of Wellington. This can be used for development and upgrades of our trails system.
- This committee is currently working with the Elora Cataract Trailway association to upgrade signage along our portion of the ECT.
- Sections of the current walking trails are linked in with the Erin Rotary Riverwalk Feasibility Study.

Business Retention and Expansion

- Wellington Business Retention & Expansion Project 2015/16
- ▶ 270 companies across Wellington were surveyed, with representation from all 4 business sectors

Manufacturing Industrial

Health Care Downtown Retail

- Over 32 businesses in the Town of Erin participated.
- Interviews showed Wellington's businesses are positive minded, excited about their business outlook and eager to make constructive changes for future success. Many businesses in the Town are eager to expand.
- Town of Erin booth at the Chamber of Commerce Home & Lifestyle Show
- Town of Erin booth at the Erin BIA Summer Celebration

New Business

- The Guardian Building, 300 Main Street has been bought. "Pintar" manufactures paint accessories and could be up and running as early as August 2016. A possible 75 jobs for the Town of Erin will be created.
- 4 Shamrock Road has been sold and has become a U-Haul and equipment rental facility, with a hardware sales outlet.
- 3 new stores have opened in Erin downtown Epiphany / Majores / Snowberry Botanicals

Signage strategy

- Wellington Signage Plan Project 2016/2017
- The Town of Erin is one of 7 municipalities represented within the County of Wellington and is a big player in the new wayfinding signage strategy
- The Signage Plan will incorporate a three phase strategy:
 - Directional signage off 400 series highway's
 - County and municipal boundary road signage
 - Pay as you play business and tourism directional/wayfinding signage
