Erin Fall Fair


Thanksgiving Weekend at the Erin Fairgrounds



P.S. Santa is coming too. Get your Christmas wishes ready.




Window Wonderland

Jennifer abandoned her extensive craft cupboard for a lathe, some chisels and a hunk of wood. That was back in 2003. Since then, she inherited her dad's lathe, bought 2 more, converted the barn into a studio space and creates exceptional works of local art.

She finds great reward in peeling away the rough exterior of a block of wood to expose the beauty held within. Thankful for the opportunity to celebrate nature`s imperfections, she embraces pieces overlooked by most woodworkers. Cankers, calluses and crotches are her diamonds in the rough. Their unpredictable hazards are outweighed by hidden treasures. A life full of storms, damage, recovery, and growth, allows her to expose and embrace the beauty that healing brings.

In 2016, she was awarded the top sculptor at the McMichael Gallery Autumn Art Sale. That was the year she got serious about integrating carving into her work. As a youngster, she felt a great connection with the gallery while gazing out over the treetops. Her art was displayed in that exact same window. Was it meant to be or just another lucky Turn-of-Fate.

Owned & Operated by a Multi-generational Family



And they tend to cows, pigs, sheep, chickens, and bees in ways that help to support the soil and the orchards of fruit and nut trees. All things raised and grown on the farm are carefully crafted into delicious farm to fork products – the dry summer sausage and pasture-fed meats are a must try that visitors can't resist adding to their basket.




Adventure Awaits
